In case of delay or mistakes on its own lines, this Company will refund the amount paid for sending the message, and no more, unless the message be repeated back, and in that case, the Company will be responsible, for actual damage only, to an amount not exceeding fifty times the sum paid for sending the message; but in no case will the Company be responsible for delays arising from interruptions in the working of its telegraphs, nor will it, in any case whatsoever, be responsible for dispatches sent beyond its own lines, or received from other lines.
