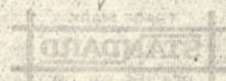
Among the pioneer settlers of the
Cowie valley we find Mr Pat
Donnelly and his wife Rose -

Both were born in Ireland and
were married in New York City in
1870 - They crossed the plains in
a covered wagon in 1874 and
settled in Ketchikan County near
the "Black House"

Mr Donnelly accumulated a large
band of sheep and in 1887 moved
them to the Yakima Valley -

He settled about one mile east
of the present city of Tripton

He first bought a section of land
and as his flock of sheep increased
he enlarged his acreage until he
owned about 1300 acres

During the season of 1906 Mr Donnelly
sold his interests on the Cowichan and
retired to private life.

Six children were born to Mr & Mrs
Donnelly

Thomas who is a prosperous farmer of Tieton

Anna who lives in Spokane (Mrs Ryan)

Katherine - who became Mrs Sam Weddle

Rose who became Mrs Albert Drago (Outlook)

Peter

Joseph

Mr Donnelly was a man among
men - His word was accepted by
all who knew him - He lived a peaceful
life and in the words of the poet -
none knew him but to love him
nor named him but to praise

He passed away in 1908 & Mrs
Donnelly in 1924
