Buena Opens Book Nook

Residents Show Interest in Project

Yakima county's newest library branch, the Book Nook, was officially opened this week in Buena by the county library under the supervision of Miss Carol Trimble, county librarian. This is the twelfth branch to be opened in the county during the current year, Miss Trimble said.

First branch was opened at Zillah quite early in the year. The others are at Union Gap, Terrace Heights, Wiley City, Tietonview, Tieton, Parker school, Marks school, Armstrong school, Nile and Granger. In addition the children at the Dorothy grade school are registered for county library mail service.

Club Women Help

The Book Nook in Buena is located in a booth in the Buena Market donated by Mrs. Arlo Neilson, proprietor. The Buena Woman's club, with Mrs. Russell Livingston as president, sponsored the actual opening of the library, while Mrs. Charles Morrison, Mrs. Ralph Bush and Miss Doris Fisher, members of the club did much of the work of redecorating and preparing the quarters.

A committee is now being formed to represent the various community organizations which will take an active interest in the library. Already named to the committee are Mrs. George Silvers, grange member, Mrs. Ralph Bush, Woman's club, Mrs. Earl Fornfest, Baptist church, and Mrs. Morrison, Methodist church.

Hours Given

The Book Nook will be open Tuesday and Thursday from 2 to 5 p. m., and Saturdays from 2 to 6. Miss Fisher, Mrs. George C. Ide and Mrs. Ernest Barbee will serve as librarians.

Approximately 400 books were taken to the Buena branch from the county library headquarters. The volumes include juvenile and adult reading and there were fiction and non-fiction types in both groups.
