The fair's 15 wide-eyed elders admiring the displays, laughing kids jumping up and down in the seats of farm machinery, youngsters giggling down beside their pet sheep, pigs or cows, oldsters at a bit awestruck at the size and color of today's apples, grangers rushing about to straighten the final entries in their booths, women admiring the home craft displays, FFA and 4-H'ers dragging parents off to see their blue ribbons, and over all the noise and color that, together with the tantalizing scent of hamburgers, make a fair.

There's something special for every day of the fair.

Wednesday is Yakima Day. In the evening Miss Fairtime 1955 will be crowned at the grandstands.

Thursday is Valley and Pioneer Day.

On Friday Gov. A. B. Langlie will be the official guest of the fair and on Saturday the grange and farm interests take over.

On Sunday there will be two special programs, a church service at 9:15 with free admission to the grounds prior to that hour and an afternoon vesper service.

A fair has to be fun, too. There'll be a carnival and midway but no smoke. This fair has asphalt.

There'll be an afternoon grandstand program including a training race, drills by sheriff's and junior posse, a parade class of horses, and special grandstand acts.

Wednesday and Thursday evening programs of grandstand acts will close with a great display of music fireworks. On Friday, Saturday and Sunday evenings there'll be a horse show.
