not have the treasurer's report.

Two new members were taken into the Club, Mrs. A. A. Gear and Mrs. A. Brandenburg.

The secretary had \$25 to add to the Library (Cantonment) fund. Also \$1<sup>00</sup> in dues.

There being no further business, the Club, in motion, adjourned.
