Dear Mr. Janeck:

Kenneth Nelson was graduated from this school in June, 1927 with an excellent record and good scholastic standing. He went to college the following September but that year or the next he was suspended from college due partially to conduct and partially to low grades. A year later Kenneth was readmitted and returned to college and since that time he has been doing very good work.

I think that the misconduct of his first year at college was caused largely by his youth. Students attending a state institution such as this one are under pretty close supervision and then when they go to college they are placed on their own responsibility and Kenneth, being much younger than the average college student, did not know how to employ his time wisely.

I might add that this school furnishes transportation from the students home to Washington, D. C. This year, due to our reduced appropriation, we were able to furnish only bus fare instead of the usualy railroad fare.

There is not a great deal of expense attached to a students attendance at Gallaudet College as room and board are furnished by the government, however, there are certain books, laboratory fees, etc., which the student must pay.
