


TOUR S-3

LAKE TAHOE — HIGH SIERRAS — SQUAW VALLEY TOUR

Approx. 5½ hrs., 112 miles. Odd dates only, June 9 - September 9. Departs Reno at 9:30 a.m. FARE \$5.50 including tax. (Lunch not included.)

You enjoy a brief city tour of Reno and then follow the route of the old pioneer trail to Donner Lake Monument. Your Gray Line tour travels through the Sierras to Squaw Valley, site of the 1960 VIII Winter Olympic Games. There you see Blythe Arena, the ski courses and the luxurious winter lodges of this now famous winter sports arena. Following lunch, you travel along the Sierra-bordered shores of Lake Tahoe to Crystal Bay before returning to Reno over 9,000 foot-high Mt. Rose with its commanding panorama of Lake Tahoe, Reno and Washoe Valley.



TOUR S-1

CARSON CITY — SOUTH SHORE LAKE TAHOE — SILVER ROUTE TOUR

Approx. $5\frac{1}{2}$ hrs., 110 miles. Even dates only, June 10 - September 10 at 9:00 a.m. from Reno. FARE \$5.50 including tax. (Lunch not included.)


After a brief Reno city tour, you travel to historic Washoe Valley and famous Bowers Mansion built by Sandy and Eilly Bowers, first of the comstock millionaires. You visit Carson City, smallest state capitol in the United States. There you see the old U.S. Mint, now the Nevada State Museum with its realistic, underground mining exhibit. From Carson City you drive to beautiful Lake Tahoe in the high Sierras. You pass Shakespeare's Rock, Glenbrook, Cave Rock, Marla Bay and arrive for lunch at Stateline with its glittering casinos. On the return trip to Reno you visit Stewart, a U.S. school for the American Indian. Back in Carson City, your Gray Line tour passes the state capitol buildings and the Nevada Governor's Mansion. You arrive back in Reno in time for a Gray Line afternoon tour of Virginia City or early evening entertainment.



TOUR S-2 DELUXE COMSTOCK TOUR — SILVER ROUTE TOUR

Approx. $3\frac{1}{4}$ hrs., 50 miles. Departs twice daily June 10 - September 10 at 9:30 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. from Reno. FARE \$4.40 including tax.

A delightful morning and afternoon tour to the liveliest ghost town in the world: VIRGINIA CITY, Nevada on the gold and silver-enriched slopes of Sun Mountain. You travel past Steamboat Springs, through the desert foothills and high over Geiger Grade to the century-ago scene of the greatest silver discovery in history, the Comstock Lode. In Virginia City, you tour through the old city streets and have ample time to actually look through such interesting places as the Bucket of Blood, Sawdust Corner, the Delta, old-west museums and the braided ruins of this richest of boom camps. Here, great mines produced over \$750,000,000 in silver and gold to help finance the Civil War and to create enormous personal empires for the men of the Comstock.
