Dear Mr. White:

You have asked for a brief biographical sketch.

Captain Kenneth Dodson was born in Portuguese West Africa, of American missionary parents. His early schooling was in England, then Pasadena High School, Taylor Nautical Academy, Washington Technical Institute, and the University of Washington. He has had over twenty-five years at sea in the Merchant Marine. and on active duty in the United States Navy. He holds an unlimited license as Master and Pilot of ocean going ships and is officially qualified to command Navy oil tankers, supply ships and attack transports. After Pearl Harbor, Dodson sailed in the first convoys to Australia and the Coral Sea. Later he participated in nine major Navy amphibious assault landings in the South Pacific. Out of some of these experiences have come his books, AWAY ALL BOATS and STRANGER TO THE SHORE. At present he is busy on a sea story for children and also the planning of two other books. In 1935 he married Oletha McCorkle. of Seattle. They have two children, Dick, 16, and Jeanie, 9. Recreational favorites: boats (any size) fishing, the outdoors, books, classical recordings, and talking with interesting people of all ages and nationalities.

That's about enough of the big talk. I'm looking forward to our visit over the mountains.
