Welcome to Port Angeles and the North Olympic Peninsula!

There is news in this little paper about shows, tours, art exhibits, swimming, fishing, hiking, golfing and many other things. It is our way of saying we're glad you came and we hope your stay is filled with great pleasure so you will want to come back often.

The favorite spot for visitors and residents alike in Port Angeles is Ediz Hook, in fact you haven't seen Port Angeles until you've seen it from there. Pictured below is just one of the many activities of this versatile landstrip, with the city across the harbor in the background.

Just 5 minutes by car from any downtown restaurant, hotel or motel, here is your chance to take an ocean trip right in the comfort of your car! A wide ribbon of sand, Ediz Hook is a natural landspit that juts 3 miles out into the sea to form one of the most perfect natural deep water harbors in the entire world. There is highway the full length of it. The surf pounds steadily, often angrily, at the rock rip-rap and driftwood protecting the highway from the open waters of the Strait of Juan de Fuca.

On the one side is the ocean-going traffic lane with frequent heavy ships passing between Port Angeles and Victoria, British Columbia, 18 miles away. On the inside of the highway strip is Port Angeles harbor with all its attendant water, timber and manufacturing activities.

The age-old battle of where to vacation--at the mountain or the seashore--is easily solved on the Olympic Peninsula. Within an hour's time you can enjoy them both.

Those of you with little time or physical disability will appreciate the ease with which you can enjoy the Olympic Mountains from the convenience of your car as it takes you right to the door of Hurricane Ridge Lodge. At the Lodge you can see into the heart of the Olympics--even inspect Blue Glacier and other inaccessible points from powerful telescopes on the patio.

You might elect to travel west on hiway 101 and turn left to Olympic Hot Springs in the heart of the Olympics, or travel a little further on the same hiway, past Lake Crescent and left again to Sol Duc Hot Springs nestled among the high hills.

Illustrated campfire talks are held each evening at many National Park sites, just after dark.



Swimming? Refreshingly cool lake swimming is awaiting the visitor at Lake Sutherland and Lake Crescent. Good swimming is waiting at Olympic Hot Springs 21 miles west off Hiway 101. Go further west on 101 are warm mineral water swim pools at Sol Duc Hot Springs. In Port Angeles Aggies Motel has an indoor pool, Chinook Motel has an outdoor one. A new municipal pool is operating daily at 225 East 5th Street swimming schedules are on the other side of this page. G

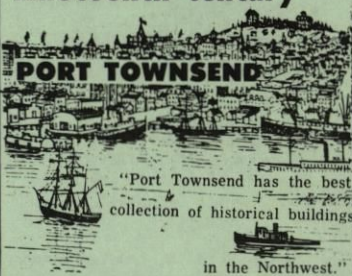

Salmon is king around Port Angeles almost any day of the year but especially in August and September when it is fishing derby time.

First is the annual Salmon Derby, with the feverish preparation weeks before as the ladder positions are jockeyed about to find the 25 top fish of the season.

At this writing the 10 top are Art Davidson, 45½; Ron Hansen, 38-3/4; Don Solway, 37½; Art Anholt, 37; Marv Lindberg, 36; Dick Miller, 35½; Bob Glas, 35-7; Frank Robinson, 35; Earl Totten, 35; Vernon Helwick, 35.

The next 15 fish currently run from 30 lbs to 35. Bigger fish than these winners have been taken here but they were not club members at the time of fishing.

The second derby and often the best one of the year is the American Legion's Annual Kids Salmon Derby. This is held Sunday September 13 and about 1,300 kids get the chance to fish for numerous prizes.

The third big derby is the annual Elks Derby.

\$10,000 in prizes will be given at the 27th Port Angeles Salmon Derby Saturday, September 5 and Sunday, September 6.

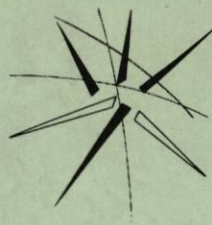

Clallam County Fair is scheduled August 28, 29 and 30 at the Fairgrounds westside in Port Angeles. This is a typical county fair, not large by most people's standards, but with a little bit of everything typical of Clallam County. There is a grandstand show regularly, with acts straight from the Ed Sullivan show.

This is the peak of the tourist season. We'd advise your getting settled in a motel or hotel or resort as early in the day as possible to insure having room accommodations at bedtime. You'll enjoy your sightseeing more knowing you have a place to go when you are tired.

Retired Railroad Locomotives are of interest to visitors with young children—on Hiway 101, in both Port Angeles and Forks.

Take a look around. As you drive the Olympic Peninsula and get into the thick stands of timber, just imagine what it must have been like when our forefathers alighted from ships on our coast as well as the east coast to make a home from the land with little more mechanical equipment than you might carry on a hike. Port Angeles was officially 102 years old June 19. It has a special distinction. It is the Second National city, set aside by President Abraham Lincoln June 19, 1862. Washington, D. C. is the first national city. Ours is an interesting history.

Pony rides for little ones out at Cap's on the edge of town, Hiway 101 east.

Play Golf! Try our scenic course high atop a hill at the east city limits. Visitors welcome.

Recreational Swimming! At Civic Pool on 5th & Chase, as follows: Sundays, 1 to 4 p.m.; Saturdays, 1 to 4 p.m. and 7-9 p.m. Adult swim 12:30 to 1 p.m. noontime, daily. Family swim Tuesday nights, 7-9; Wednesday nights, teens; adults, Thursdays. Daily recreational swim, 1-4.

Art Exhibits. Port Angeles and Clallam County have an active art colony resulting in excellent exhibits several places. Aggie's Restaurant, the Public Library and Grebin's all constantly exhibit. Grebins have a spectacular ceramic mushroom display and new paintings are shown every six weeks.

Hurricane Ridge, of course! Frequent terrace talks are given at the Lodge. Nature hikes are conducted on nearby paths that display the mountain in its endless beauty. The snow was very late to recede this year and spots of it still remain, with glacial flowers blooming abundantly everywhere.

Pioneer Memorial Museum is a must stop on the way to Hurricane Ridge. Located at the edge of the city limits on the way up, they can brief you as to weather conditions at the Ridge. This museum was built by the high school trades class several years ago and is a combination historical and naturalist museum. Here is found a huge relief map of the entire Olympic National Park, a good way to orient yourself before going any farther. Behind the large museum building is the Beaumont cabin which was built from the land in 1887.
