I am of course always on the look out for any trap that is in any way different than anything I now have. Any size, make, or model, mouse to bear, if it's a trap I'm interested. Even the old wood mouse and rat

Traps are of interest, preferably with the lettering etc. or them being legible.

I would very much like to buy or trade for one of each size of the old F.C. Taylor Fan Letter guns. One a .22 and the other .38 calibre.

Am hoping some day to get some of the Libbs dope traps which were made for use in the west on coyote. These coil spring traps had an arm attached to them that came up when the trap was tripped. On the end was a cyanide capsule which when bitten by the trapped animal, caused a quick death. You may have seen them somewhere in the past.

I have an old magazine here showing and advertising the Krago clutch trap which was made at Missoula, Mont. This one don't even look like a trap. Would like to get one or more of these too.

Better close for this time, hoping I may hear from you, especially if you are interested in any of the hand made traps I have here.
