Dear Book Department Head:

Sorry my explanatory letter did not reach you in time today to cause you relief from uncertainty about our appearance.

I presume the enclosed picture will be too late, which is entirely satisfactory with me. It is one requested in a telephone call from Chapin Foster.

It is possible that besides the two Indians traveling with me others will meet us. These would include the succeeding religious leader and direct descendant of the Priest Rapids prophets, a long braid; his granddaughter, a 17 year old Toppenish Pow Wow beauty princess, a Yakima girl; and his wife, a Yakima woman.

This addition would possibly result from our stop late Tuesday afternoon, Oct. 9, en route from Portland to Tacoma, at Fort Lewis to present a copy of the book to the commanding general. There is to be no publicity on this. This presentation was the wish of the religious leader, now dead less than a month. The Yakima Firing Center is under Fort Lewis jurisdiction and the Hanapum burial ground is on the border of the firing center. If the additional people decide to come earlier than to meet us at Seattle as previously planned, they will be an additional attraction to the party, and I feel they will come when I tell them today.
