This letter concerns the removal and reburial of prehistoric Indian graves from Columbia Park Island between Kennewick and Kenland, Wash.

Background: Early in June, 1968, I was notified by the Army Corps of Engineers, Walla Walla office, that an unmarked Indian burial site on Columbia Island Raxk had been exposed by ea thmoving equipment operated by enton County. At the request of the National Park Service, Westen "egional Office, San Francisco, California, I visited the site and salvaged what I could of the burials. First, all human bones exposed by the bulldozing were gathered and stored in cardboard boxes. Second, archaeological test excavations were performed in orde to remove any remaining burials. his work yielded remains of 13 graves. All of these graves were unmarked, having been covered by three feet of wate deposited silts. All were in a flexed position with heads pointed west and feet pointed east. Most of these graves contained red ochre stains, some contained a few Dentallium shell beads; and two had small bits of copper interred with them. No other artifacts were found. I estimated the age of the burials is about 200 years old. Finally I recommended to the National ark Service that further wo k should be conduced at the burial site and an adjacent campsite in order to salvage these antiquities from ultimate destruction by activities connected with park development.

Current work: On October 10,1968, the National Park Service issued a permit authorizing Washington State University and the Mid-Columbia Archaeological Society to conduct archaeological excavations in order to salvage and document the antiquities on Columbia Park Island. In the course of the work 22 additional graves of the same sort described above were discovered (Note, that would be 13 plux 22). No more are believed to exist at that site. Excavation at an adjacent campsite has also given

no indication of the presence of any burials.

Problem: I assume the the Yakima Nation wants to claim the exhumed remains salvaged by these excavations. The problem is where and whe to reburn these r mains. I have spoken with Click relander Yakima bout this problem. He suggested that I contact you so that a burial place and time can be decided. Perhaps it will be possible to have a burial ceremony sometime this spring. Please let me know about your decision .If I can be of any further assistance, don't hesitate to contact me. 



