Dear Mr. Hodges:

During my conversation with Mr. Clifford Dolph, director of the Maryhill Museum of Fine Arts yesterday, we discussed the possibility, even at this late date, that the Oregon Archaeological Society would be able to hold its October meeting in the museum's Indian room.

I was talking with Mr. Dolph concerning my book tour relative to publications of my book, Drummers and Dreamers which starts in Yakima Oct. 6 and will include the Maryhill Museum Sunday afternoon, Oct. 7.

Some of the Priest Rapids Indians are to accompany me on the trip.

In the event that a meeting of the society would be held, I could talk briefly concerning tribes of the Mid-Columbia, based on my own extensive research and interviews with many of the old timers.

Mr. Dolph said that the courtesy of the museum would be extended to members and guests of the society in event they are interested in meeting in the Indian Room.

Invitations to the Maryhill appearance are being sent out similar to the enclosed. They will include however a notation to present the invitation at the museum desk for courtesy admittance.

Some of these invitations will no doubt include members of the society in The Dalles, White Salmon, Hood River and other areas close to Maryhill.

I am enclosing a circular concerning the book and other information pertaining to it.

From Maryhill we will go to Portland for a book tour appearance at Mills on Monday, and will remain over in Portland Tuesday morning and perhaps the early afternoon. One of the invitations being sent out in connection with the appearance at J.K. Mill co. is also enclosed.
