As you may no doubt know, the Yakima Indian Reservation of over one million acres was a few years ago the habitat of upwards of 10,000 "wild horses."

And as you may know Washington is a state whose residents have strong interest in horses and a valuable historical background concerning horses.

I have several years collection of "wild horse" material from this and other areas. One chapter in a book scheduled for publication before midwinter deals with wild horses and may be expanded to include more than the Northwest.
