Dear Mrs. Stewart,

The past few days have been warm and today we enjoyed (I did anyway) a real thunder storm. - Mr. and Mrs. Stewart Edward White are guests at our camp. They came last evening and will remain until Tuesday. They are somewhat on the Docter Mexican side, so you can imagine how much we are enjoying their visit. Mr. White is going to join our Mt. Whitney club and this morning he promised me that he would write an article for our next Journal. Mr. Ellis gave him copy of our last number and I promised to send him one of the first. They expect to reach their home in Santa Barbara in two weeks. I wish Mr. Stewart would send one

for me, to Stewart Edward White, Santa Barbara, and I will pray him when I get home. While at Eschum I visited Pice Valley and went with a party to the Gaulty Park of the Seacah. The falls are beautiful, and the scenery grand. — A week from tomorrow Mrs. Ellis and I are going to Henry's Cañon with Mr. Ellis, and from there we are going to Independence.

When leaving home I had no idea of going further than Big Meadows so of course am not prepared (so far as wardrobe is concerned) for such a trip, but am going anyway.
