It was indeed a great shock we received when we read of Duncan Duncans death as well as Dan McDonald and we need such men as these but as you know some one will be found to take the place but it will be hard to find Duncans equal, attended the funeral and it was the largest I ever attended a very worthy respect for such a good soldier.

Will have a meeting of the road committee soon and take care of the matters you mention in your letter, the contractors are to start work very soon we understand and we are all hoping another contract will be up soon for bids, it will not be long to the spring weather will be here and then the picnic.
