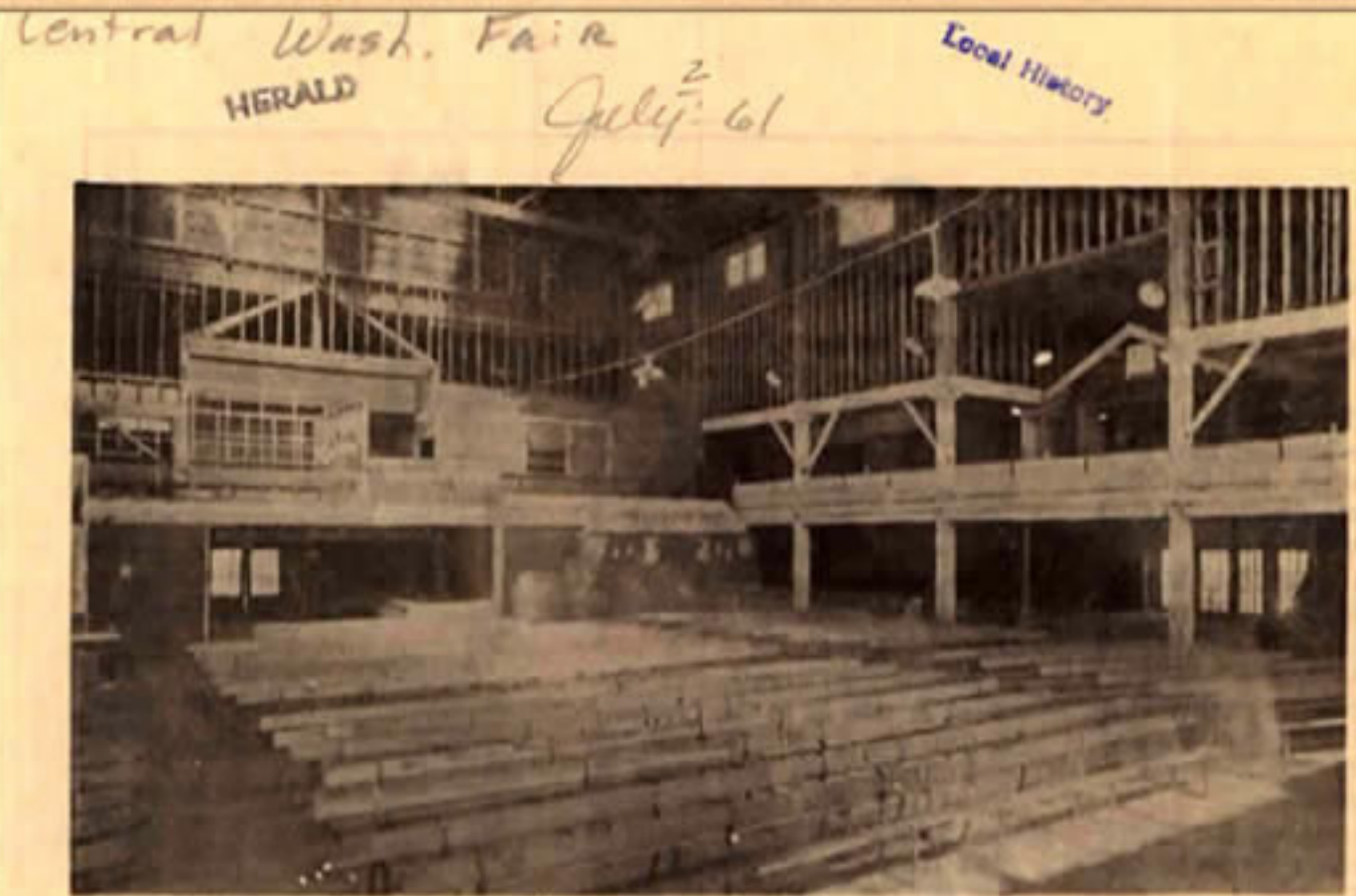

Fair Altering Agriculture Building For 4-H Displays

The mezzanine floor of the huge agriculture building on the Central Washington Fairgrounds will be remodeled this month to accommodate 4-H displays during the fair Sept. 27-Oct. 1. D. R. Canfield of Granger, president of the Central Washington Fair board, announced Saturday.

Work on remodeling the floor will commence July 5 Canfield said. Workmen will install moveable panels, enlarge or remodel

booths and building display racks for 4-H displays.

School exhibits will continue to be housed in the second floor wing adjacent to the mezzanine floor.

"The entire floor will be an education center where adults can see the result of youth activities, and youths can display their products for premium money or ribbons," Canfield explained.

The renovation process is the first major overhauling the agricultural building will have had since it was built almost 60 years ago.
