SPECIAL LEVY

REPORT: Dr. Jack Frisk reported that there were three
alternatives for the school district due to the
failure of the special levy:

- 1) Resubmit the levy and bond issue to the voter
in the spring.
- 2) The legislature would assume the responsibility
of funds for schools.
- 3) Cut back could be made, eliminating about 100
employees.

Dr. Frisk stated that to resubmit the proposal would certainly
cost more. Chairman Weeber stated that the committee may have
to have a special meeting on this problem.

B-E DAY: The date had tentatively been established as February
19. Vice-Chairman Shrader stated we need an agenda
of the program for the day. Dr. Frisk stated he would like to
have the people see schools as they are. It was proposed to send
a questionnaire out asking the people what they would like to see.
Dr. Frisk was to appoint a chairman from the school district and
Chairman Weeber was to appoint a chairman from the Chamber so
both could coordinate the program. They would meet before the
next Committee meeting.
