After 52 years of Catholic Education, Holy Resary School, Moxee City, graduated its last 8th grade class at 7:30 p.m., June 5th, with Fr. John Shaw, pastor, as celebrant of the Mass. Visitors were Sr. Annunciata, Assistant Provincial Superior from Providence Heights, Issaquah and Sister Aurelia. In the sanctuary were the two resident priests of the parish, Fr. Terrence Koreski and Fr. Michael Ryan. Cynthia Champoux was the recipient of the annual scholarship effered by the Young Ladies Institute of Yakima, #14. A reception was given in the parish hall after the Mass for the faculty and graduates; the ladies of the parish providing floral decorations and refreshments.

The present faculty are Hollis Sweeney, principal and 7th & 8th instructor; Sister Yvonne Perrault, 5th & 6th grades; Mrs. Coralie Derrick, 3rd & 4hh grades and Sr. Mary Berenice, 1st & 2nd grades. Mrs. Harriet Desmarais was teachers' aide.

The Holy Resary School Evaluation committee, appointed by Fr. Shaw, made a complete study of possible supply of Sisters for the new year, salaries for more lay teachers, enrollment, heavy school repairs, double grade system and proximity to Yakima area parochial schools. Trends were obtained from reports of the past 10 years of operation. The Sisters of Charity of Providence have staffed the school with as many as 11 from its founding in 1915 with over 200 pupils, when it was also a boarding school for high school girls until 1956. Now the school is staffed with 2 Religious, with no promise of Sisters for the new year. The present low enrollment is 100. Approximately, 8,320 students have attended the school the past 52 years.

A summation of this complete evaluation report was given to the parishiomers at a general parish meeting Feb. 9 and again Feb. 11, Sunday, with a questionnaire for all the parishioners. Thefinal decision of closure was given after due consideration of the local educational and ecclesiastical authorities.
