Our Catalog No. 25 is enclosed. In it we discuss Permoplast Modeling Clay, various other art clays, school chalks, crayons, water colors, and other related items. Prices are net f.o.b. our factory here in Indianapolis.


We buy raw clays from many different sources. Many of our clays are native Indiana clays and most of those come from the Clay City, Indiana area. The base clay of Marblex is a clay from that area.

Marblex, as you know, is a self-hardening clay. Water base clays, however, on drying do shrink. We do not recommend that Marblex be used on a wire armature. There is apt to be some cracking as the clay dries and shrinks.

We have found that if you dry Marblex and other clays of this type slowly the results will be quite good. If the clay dries too rapidly the outside will dry and the inside will still be moist. Consequently, there will be some cracking of the clay. We suggest that you make the walls of the clay piece as thin as you can.
