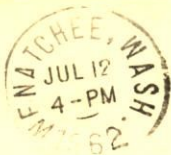

Can you tell me the year in which Major Granville O. Haller made his expedition against the Snake Indians, in and around Fort Boise, in southern Idaho?

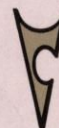
There seems to be very little about this expedition in the references available to me. The confusing thing is that there is a discrepancy in the dates, in the years, in the material we have available here.
