REASONS FOR REPEALING INCOME TAX BEING TOLD ON TELEVISION

LOS ANGELES - The Liberty Amendment Committee of the U.S.A., the organization sponsoring repeal of the federal personal income tax, is ready to tell its story on television.

Willis E. Stone, the group's National Chairman, has filmed a 13-week series of 15-minute commentaries designed to acquaint his audience with "what happens to their money once it leaves their pockets via the tax route."

The Liberty Amendment would eliminate all federal business-type competition with the private sector except those activities "specified in the Constitution." Stone contends enough federal spending would be eliminated to make income-tax repeal fiscally responsible. His studies over many years have been based on annual federal budgets and the relationship of federal programs to the powers delegated to the federal government by the Constitution.

Ordinarily a group such as this sponsors its own programs over the air, depending upon audience contributions to sustain it. Stone is deviating from the rule by offering the show to local and national business backing in the belief that it will perform an outstanding selling job for private sponsors.

The show's pilot run at KTHI-TV in Fargo, N.D., has been termed "very successful" by its sponsor, Sands Steel Building Co., and is now in its second showing over the Fargo outlet.
