Dear Mr. Tilton:

Having returned from a vacation trip into California,  
I am endeavoring to wade through a stack of mail.

I am enclosing, for your perusal, one of the advance circulars  
issued but not yet put into circulation by Caxtons.

If you will be so kind as to indicate the placement of your permit  
number, ~~para~~ previously referred to, or send a sample of such a circular,  
then it will enable the publisher to print something to your liking.  
Otherwise the name, address etc. will be printed on the present circular.

When I receive this back, it will be turned into the publisher and  
you will receive the supplies in plenty of time.

I do not know exactly how the book cover size (with wide margins)  
litho of the Quigley western can be used when it is published. This will  
not be until about the time of publication. But I will see that you get  
some of these. Quigley, to my way of thinking, is right up there with  
Remington and Russell. The litho will be the cover of Drummers and  
Dreamers, without lettering and with Quigley's picture and info. about  
him on the back.

I've been keeping my eye open for anything in the line of desirable  
artifact collections, and have a few lines out. One man, formerly from  
this region but now in California, I have been told, has some material  
he may eventually part with or wish to sell because of moving, and

there are other reports like that but none of them have panned out.

I also pick up, during my California travels and stops into a couple of book stores, that the book, Indian Relics (I'm not sure but think it is by Brown, ) is out of print ~~and~~ now and much in demand throughout the west. It was published about three or four years ago at \$3 I believe and concerns mainly Indian relics of the northwest. The stores say they keep getting inquiries for it but find that the publisher is out of books. I mention that in case you bump into any copies, they'd be good for a quick turnover with any dealer handling "estern material in the "orthwest or San Francisco.

Meanwhile, back to work. Your cooperation is highly appreciated and I hope to reciprocate, some way, some time. I only hope that D and D comes up to my own belief.

The circular does not mention, and I am asking Caxtons to "re-do" it or get ready to for the dealer printings like yours, to include introduction by Dr. F.W. Hodge, cover by E.B. Quigley and that one of the Priest Rapids Dams has been named for the "anapums.

A Federal Power Commission decision on a dam building license or permit should be forthcoming in about 60 days. Were Congress in session later than july I'd look for abig blow up like Hells Canyon, but maybe this will get by without a big argument.
