I am sending a clipping from the Wenatchee Daily World, Nov. 4, 1954,
Celia Ann Dick Tells the Story of Na-ha-me-ilt, Chief of the Wenatchees.

This is a story I had heard about but it was only recently that I
was able to obtain a date so that I could obtain a copy.

May I comment that here again, and for an unexplainable reason,
although I assure it is not deliberate, an article appears in the Wenatchee
paper that follows the Kamiakin territorial claim.

A previous clipping (published later but sent earlier) also
carried out the trend which has been noted in Wanapum Notes and in
microfilm transcripts, that Kamiakin claimed to represent Indians over
~~xxxxxxxxxxxxxxxx~~ who did not regard him as chief, and that he claimed land
that he had no just right to claim.
