HOUSE BILL NO. 166

State of Washington 37th Regular Session

Read first time January 19, 1961, and referred to Committee on Highways.

AN ACT Relating to public highways; authorizing the Washington state highway commission and the joint fact-finding committee on highways, streets, and bridges to determine the feasibility of a secondary highway No. 3B, from Toppenish, thence westerly to Woodland; and making an appropriation.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

NEW SECTION. Section 1. The Washington state highway commission and the joint fact-finding committee on highways, streets, and bridges are authorized to determine the feasibility of a secondary highway, No. 3B, from Toppenish westerly and southwesterly to Woodland and, in part, via the Lewis river. The feasibility study shall include but shall not be confined to the following:

- (1) Necessary reconnaissance surveys, including location, construction cost, and roadway design;
- (2) The construction cost total in respect to its becoming a part of the modern state integrated highway system;
 - (3) The length of construction time required;
- (4) The possibility of making use of federal agency funds if available.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. There is hereby appropriated from the motor vehicle fund to the Washington state highway commission and the joint fact-finding committee on highways, streets, and bridges the sum of sixty thousand dollars, or so much thereof as is necessary to carry out the provisions of this act.
