ABILL A purpose. The ex-

To aid the several States in constructing post roads.

- Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 - 3 That for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of the
 - 4 Federal Highway Act, approved November 9, 1921 (42
 - 5 Stat. 212; Code of Laws of the United States, p. 665), and
 - 6 all Acts amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto, and
 - 7 to establish post roads, provide for the common defense and
 - 8 general welfare, there is hereby authorized and directed to
 - so be appropriated, out of any money in the Treasury not
- 10 otherwise appropriated, such sums as the Congress may
- 11 from time to time deem advisable to be expended in the

- ! improvement of rural post roads over which rural carriers
- 2 travel in serving the rural routes in addition to those roads
- 3 now or hereafter to be included in the Federally aided road
- 4 system.
- 5 Sec. 2. The sums of money appropriated by Congress
- 6 under authority of this Act shall be apportioned by the
- 7 Secretary of Agriculture of the United States among the
- 8 several States in proportion to the total mileage of rural
- 9 routes within the respective States and shall be available
- 10 only when and upon condition that the several States, or
- 11 subdivisions therein, or both, appropriate and make available
- 12 an equal sum exclusively for the same purpose. The ex-
- 13 penditure of all such sums of money shall be made by the
- 14 highway departments of the several States or by the equiv-
- 15 alent office or officer thereof, as provided in the Federal
- 16 Highway Act of November 9, 1921.
- 17 Sec. 3. That section 6 of said Federal Highway Act
- 18 is hereby amended, authorizing and creating a third class
- 19 of highways to consist of both those intracounty and inter-
- 20 county highways over which passes the United States mail
- 21 by rural mail carriers, first selecting and improving those
- 22 roads which shall most usefully and conveniently contribute
- 23 to rounding out and expanding the system of primary and
- 24 secondary highways, and to continue enlarging and expand-
- 25 ing until all rural mail routes shall be improved in the

- manner decided by the respective State highway depart-
- 2 ments: Provided, That in selecting and improving rural mail
- 3 roads, as provided herein, due consideration shall be given
- 4 roads which shall best serve the agricultural needs of the
- 5 country in obtaining access to the Federal-aid system, the
- 6 rail and water shipping points, and the markets.
- 7 SEC. 4. All Acts or parts of Acts in any way incon-
- 8 sistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed,
- and this Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage.
