I have given the Yakima Nation committee (which consists of their
Tribal Council) a memo concerning your desire to receive 25 of these
booklets.

It turned out 64 pps. and with several more pictures than when I wrote
you. I believe it is a worthwhile item, but time will tell.

I have noted to the Yakimas that it should be returnable. The price
for printing figured out about as we had it deduced, making it
advisable for \$1 sale, 60-40 to dealers.

I shall keep you posted on D and D.

Incidentally the Quigley lithos will be straight give-aways at the
store upon publication of the book. I'm as sensitive as Quig about
quality reproduction. To be sure, I wish to see what kind of a four color
job is turned out.
