I have built up an extensive list of potential purchasers foreach city or region in the state and estimate that I have over 200 for the Tri-Cities area. Prior to publication any contact I have with these people, through mailing lists, will invite them to order through their local dealer, and it is necessary to know at this time your plans concerning the book's handling, so I can complete my work. Later I will be too bush with other activities to back track and check out pddd dealers, but do wish to work in closest cooperation with them if they wish me to.

You know your clients, and if you are interested, besides Edxadzing advance ordering, I could provide you with slips like the advance circular and as contacts are made, I am sure you will be adding to your advance order before publication. One dealer at HERMANNI The Dalles was reticent to advance order five copies yet since them I have sent him firm orders from people in the Dalles for six copies: All he as to do is have the books on hand for the customers.

I hope to hear from you shortly and express my regretagain that I could not see you personally. I don't know whether my schedule will permit a day off from my regular work that would take me to your again again before the winter sets in.
