The Book of Exodus.

Key text: 3:10. "Come now, therefore, and I will send thee unto Pharaoh, that thou mayest bring forth my people the children of Israel out of

Egypt."

The book of Genesis ends with "a coffin in Egypt." Everything in Egypt ends in a coffin, but even the coffin suggests hope, for Joseph had predicted that his people should be delivered and they would take his coffin with them. The book of Exodus is a fulfilment of Joseph's prophecy, and on the basis of this purpose we have the following analysis:
