

I thank you, also, for telling me about your forthcoming book, DRUMMERS & DREAMERS. Unhappily for both of us, it is out of my territory. I have a small but enthusiastic clientele which is interested in the Rocky Mountain States and in cowboys, cattle, outlaws and officers everywhere in the West. I have never been successful in selling books about Indians and the Northwest. I do get some of these books, now and then, and do catalog them when I accumulate enough of them. But I know from experience that it would not be profitable for me to circularize my customers on your new book. I would be wasting my time and money, and your circulars.

I am sorry that I do not have at present any of the Reports of Commissioner of Indian Affairs (except those I have offered you before) and none at all of the volumes of The War of the Rebellion.
