Dear Pete:

I appreciate the outlined sketch of the end papers for Drummers and Dreamers, which is being returned in the same mail.

I well know how these work rushes can get one down. I too got caught in one and while I intended to get this back to you yesterday, I laid down a bit and that was all till next morning. Then I reasoned the weekend would hold up delivery, so here tis.

Quig has finished the painting and it's on its way. I had a couple of shots made of it and in time, when the photog gets around to it, will send one to you. I'm very pleased with it. It is really tops.

I don't know if the sketch, started, is the one you intend to finish or not. If not, here are some suggestions, which can be used on the finished product. It however won't be necessary to change if the submitted sketch is to be the finished one.

The Wanapums should be located on the right bank instead of the left. (Description of right or left by facing downstream)

P'na, the principal village site, should be on right, at Priest Rapids Dam site.

The Wanapum houses are mat lodges, instead of tepees (tipis) Pix to help give you an idea of this are enclosed with the drawings.

Kosith ~~wednesday~~ should also have mat lodge. It is at the junction of the Snake with the Columbia.

Lake Wallula is now the official name of the 60 mile long pool created by McNary Dam. And it really is! There are waves five feet high sometimes there now, kicked up by the wind, a coast guard det. located there, hundreds of boats etc.

Locate Palus on north bank of Snake river at its junction with Palouse river, and west of the Palouse river. (Either style lodge suitable there)

Crossed stone club and tomahawk hardly acceptable in any of the country. Drum looks okay

Locate DeDO Celilo Fishing Village on Oregon shore about 89 miles below McNary Dam. It is a historic spot and will remain so.

Wyampums... (use mat lodge rather than tepee )  
Same for the Wishams on the Washington shore.



Use either the pen or ink or brush or ink that you work easiest with

Everything else looks like you have the right idea

The way things are shaping up, navigation is going to be a big issue, and navigation will be a big thing in development of the river. Maybe something like a boat would work ok on the lower river, but not on the upper river.

I don't think it necessary for any more suggestions, other than the important ones, that the Wanapums had the mat lodges that were long affairs. Make them plain on top, not with poles sticking out.

I'm enclosing, also, a couple of "simulated" eagle feathers. They're quite distinctive as to tips, spots etc.

I don't think I ever got anything definite from you on what this type of work is worth, and I'm not up on it. I figured somewhere around \$25. But if I'm wrong, let me know. I'll be shooting a little along now and then till I wash it up.

Hope you get a break soon so you can finish it up. I still have a hunch that they are getting ready to go fast on the book if they have this in. All the big news about Priest Rapids (its hitting banners all over this part of the country now, and later will be even more widespread, newspaper stories all over, wire releases, magazine stories etc. because it is now the bell-wether of the Partnership Plan, the new power policy, and they are saying it may set off a bigger uproar when the hearing for the actual permit is held before the Public Power Commission next year, than Hells Canyon. If it doesn't, it will mean an entire new power policy has been inaugurated.

Thanks for your trouble Pete. Hope I've given you enough now to go ahead on.
