North Yakima, Wash., October 26, 1914.

There is enclosed herewith a copy of the Reclamation Extension Act and Public Notice of the Secretary of the Interior, with Form of Acceptance of the terms and conditions of the Act for your use.

If you desire to take advantage of the 20 year extension, this acceptance should be detached and signed, (by both husband and wife if married); acknowledged before a notary public; and then filed in the office of the Reclamation Service at North Yakima, Washington, for the Tieton Project; and at Sunnyside, Washington, for the Sunnyside Project, with Post Office Money Order for 60 cents payable to the County Auditor of the county in which your land is located to cover cost of recording.

THIS PUBLIC NOTICE APPLIES TO ALL LANDS SUB-
SCRIBED TO THE WATER USERS ASSOCIATION WHETHER COVERED
BY WATER RIGHT APPLICATION OR NOT.

The First payment under this public notice becomes due December 1, 1914, and the amount will be two per cent of the total unpaid portion of the Construction charge. If not paid on or before December 1, 1914, the law provides the addition of a penalty of one per cent, and the addition of a further penalty of one per cent on the first day of each month thereafter until paid.

Since this payment cannot be accepted by the Fiscal Agent until after the filing of acceptance of the terms and conditions of the Act by you, it is important that you act promptly.

We, of the Reclamation Service, believe that the passage of this Extension Act marks a turning point in the progress and prosperity of the projects. Hoping that it may prove so to you personally, I am,
