



## 10 GOOD REASONS FOR JOINING THE AMERICAN PROFESSIONAL WRITERS' CLUB

- l—Membership in this organization will assure you of a voice in a group working to increase the *total earning potential* of the nation's writing fraternity. Writers, too long, have been the low men on the economic totem pole. This is your chance to start doing something about it.
- 2—Membership in this club will help to make possible  $\alpha$  headquarters building in Washington, which you and other eligible members can use during your visits to the nation's capital.
