My request for publications from Bulletin Listings, 1951 to Dec. 31, 1960, is based on my need for correlative, pattern and comparative material indicated in the publications.

Additionally I am working on an authorized publication for a major Indian tribe, in which project the indicated material will be of much assistance.

And, additionally, I am providing much material from microfilm transcripts, Indian agency and other documents, to several proficient student authors with whom I am acquainted and officials connected with both state and national agencies who know of my work. Some are as far distant as Florida. Pay is involved in no instance and I in turn benefit from various areas in which they can make special research for me.

I will refer you to various Smithsonian staff members who know me personally or indirectly, Matthew W. Stirling, John C. Ewers and Douglas Osborne. The latter, when at the University of Washington will tell you how as consultant, without pay, for the Grant County PUD, I assisted in working out the turning over of \$50,000 by the Grant County PUD of Washington, through Congressional Legislation, to the University of Washington for field work in the Priest Rapids and Hananum Dam Reservoirs.

I will also refer you to U.S. Senator Warren G. Magnuson and U.S. Sen. Henry M. Jackson of the State of Washington and Congresswoman Catherine Day, 4th Congressional District, State of Washington.

The material I am requesting is of a type not always immediately available from a library repository, nor for the length of time it may be needed.

I sincerely hope this material may be sent, for which I anticipate to pay postage (a procedure one time several years ago).
