In reply to your letter of
the 26th and 28th ultimo, in regard
to the Piute Indians, I have to say
that considerable correspondence
has passed between the War Depart-
ment and this Department, relative
to the best disposition to be made
of these Indians; and in the month
of June last the Honorable Secretary
of War was requested to issue the
necessary orders to compel the fugi-

tives to return to their reservation.

The necessary orders were issued to Gen^l. Schofield, directing him to comply with the request of this Department. It was hoped that these instructions would be promptly complied with, but it does not appear that any further action has been taken in the matter, and temporary provision having been made for the support of the Piutes where they now are, I have concluded to make no further efforts for their return to Yakima, for the present.
