but includes numerous references of possible interest to the Palouse
in relation to Betition 222. It also contains numerous Yakima
references, estimates of tribes, locations, depredations, inclination
for war, chiefs of the various tribes, etc.

The highlights of each letter is noted on attached yellow slip, thereby making a quick scan easier. The residue letters are included to show the extent of the other material.

I will shortly send similar material dealing with the Yakimas and other Eastern Washington tribes, taken from the microcopy, and I am hopeful that as they are added to the various MS they will fill out the picture for those interested in the various cases. They are so interlocked that it is difficult to make a more extensive breakdown, hence, I think you will find the previously submitted MS, Colville, Yakima, Umatilla, Wanapum, a basis for a slowly developing file of extensive material that both attorneys and ethnologists interested in the cases may find interesting. How ver I suspect that considerable of the material is already known to ethnologists, but I doubt that they have transcoriptions of it.

A quick scan of the material would be more enlightening than several pages of correspondence.
