


The Trail of History through the Mother Lode



Groveland School has provided education for generations of residents of this year-round community.






Modern Trailer home contrasts with the many historic structures and is a type of residence popular in the area. Travel trailer accommodations are also available all along Highway 120.

New Route 120, the "Big Oak Flat Road", presently completed over some length of the approaches, will be one of the fine highways of tomorrow. This bridge over the South Fork of Tuolumne River was opened in 1962.

Wide stretches, easy grades and broad sweeping curves characterize portions of the "Big Oak Flat Road" now in use. Other new sections opening from time to time will make it a delight to travel.



The route best known to Bay Area residents is also the most spectacular way to Yosemite for Southern Californians. If you want scenery, take the "Big Oak Flat Road", Highway 120, it takes you through the big trees and the high country, and lets you

look down from wide turnouts at breathtaking panoramas of the Yosemite Valley below—the falls, the peaks, the majestic grandeur. It's almost like flying, except you can take your time and drink in its beauty. On the way down, the falls all around, you will go past the road to Tioga Pass then through three tunnels to the Valley entrance.

Along "Big Oak Flat Road", Highway 120 you'll find every few miles a nice place to stop—an inn, an historical monument, a town, a place to stay—with good food and friendly hospitality. The meals will absolutely amaze you with their gournet flavor, generous portions and modest prices. The fried chicken is "out of this world", tender steaks are thick and juicy, and apples, cherries and purple Italian onions are simply delightful. All along this great route people know how to live, and they'll be happy to help you enjoy the country and get the most out of your trip.
