

## More than 4,000 books mailed in library program

More than 4,000 books have been mailed to patrons during the first three months of a pilot program sponsored by the Yakima Valley Regional Library.

The new Mail Library Service is being tested on seven rural routes in the East Selah, Ahtanum, Wapato, Grandview, Toppenish and Nile areas.

Shirley Lewis, Outreach Services, reports that the most popular titles have been "Kramer vs. Kramer," "The Rose," "The Scarsdale Medical Diet" and "Ashes in the Wind." Lawn and garden books and exercise books have also been very popular.

The Outreach Services staff has begun to distribute the summer supplement to the 1980 catalog to Mail Library Service patrons. It contains 100 more books available through Mail Library Service,

including best sellers, romances and westerns, Lewis said.

The Mobile Library schedule for the summer is also available at all of the Yakima Valley Regional Library outlets. It will be in Southeast Yakima on alternate Mondays, July 28; Aug. 11, 25; Sept. 8, 22, at Yakima Specialties from 2:30-2:50 and at the Southeast Community Center, 3-3:30 p.m.

It will visit retirement apartments on alternate Wednesdays, visiting Madison from 9-10 a.m. and Willows from 10:15-10:45 a.m. July 23; Aug. 6, 20; Sept. 3, 17. It will be at the Camlu from 9-10 a.m. and Glenn Acres, 10:15-10:45 a.m. July 16, 30; Aug. 13, 27; Sept. 10, 24.

It will make fire station and hospital deliveries once a month on Thursdays, Aug. 7 and Sept. 4.

It will visit nursing homes on alternate Thursdays and Fridays, visiting Summitview Manor from 1-2 p.m.; Central Convalescent from 2:10-3:10 p.m. and Good Samaritan, 3:30-4:15 p.m. July 17, 31; Aug. 14, 28; Sept. 11, 25.

On alternate Fridays, July 25; Aug. 8, 22 and Sept. 5, 19, it will visit Fountains from 9-9:30 a.m.; Crescent Convalescent, 9:40-10:10 a.m. and Eden House, 10:40-11:10 a.m.

On July 18; Aug. 1, 15 and Sept. 12, 26, it will visit the Chalet from 9-9:30 a.m.; Yakima Convalescent, 9:40-10:10 a.m. and Strawn's, 10:30-11 a.m.

For those who are unable to get out of their homes to visit the library, Home Service will deliver books, records and magazines on alternate Fridays.
