This painting came from the estate of the late Henry B. Cabot, Chestnut Hill, Massachusetts ("The Lowells talk only to Cabots; the Cabots talk only to God") and had been in the possesion of the Cabot family for two generations. It has been borrowed by and exhibited in a number of the country's leading museums during the past fifty years or more, and was but recently shown in a large exhibition at the Fogg Museum, of Harvard University.

Jan Both (his brother, Andries, was also a painter) Dutch; born about 1618 at Utrecht; died there 1652. Andries born about 1608; died at Venice before 1649. Pupils of Abraham Bloemart at Utrecht; influenced by Claude Lorain. Jan was a landscape painter; his brother, Andries, often added the figures.

The painting was bought by the Seuferts in Feb. of this year especially for ### exhibition at the Maryhill Museum where they have previously placed a number of other fine paintings from their collection.
