Chappell planted only a few trees. N.M.Richards, now of Seattle planted some more and McLennan who later owned the place and from whom Mr.Madill bought planted some more. Mr.Madill has had the place 12 years and finished the planting until now there are 100 acres

The Beck place in Fruitvale, east of the railroad track. Now owned by Peters. Adam Beck homestead? Mr. Jack had it for a time. Ask Snodgrass about it. The Beck place was just south of the Vaughn place. The Beck orchard was said by Mr. Madill to be 48 years old when he bought 12 years ago. Some old Anjou trees! Are they there yet? Mr. Snodgrass said

that Mr. Madill meant the Vaughn place.

W.L. Wright came to Fruitvale in 1894. He planted 100 apple trees that year and in XXX the next year XXXXXXX completed the planting of the 20 acres. W.W. Scott place was in bearing then. Does not know how much there was on the Alderson place. Mr. Wright is under the impression that there was not much orchard on the Alderson place in 1894 and that most of it was planted later.
