Dear Mr. Relander:

Samuel Hill is listed in the <u>Cornell University Register and Catalogue</u>, 1875-76, p. 28, as a freshman student in literature. Apparently, he spent one year or less at Cornell, for his name does not appear in subsequent <u>Registers</u>, and he is listed in alumni directories as being in attendance only in 1875.

The Record of Entries for 1875-76, p. 182, gives the following information:

1. Birthplace: Union, Randolph Co., N. C.;

2. Guardian: R. J. Hill of Minneapolis, Minnesota;

3. Secondary education: Minneapolis High School;

4. Year entered Cornell: 1875.

If Mr. Hill finished his freshman year, he would have taken the following courses, as listed in the Register and Catalogue, 1875-76, p. 93.

First Term: Algebra, Latin, Physiology, Rhetoric &

Composition:

Second Term: Geometry, Latin, Anglo-Saxon, Rhetoric &

Composition;

Third Term: Trigonometry & Mensuration, Latin, Botany, Anglo-

Saxon.

I am afraid that is all the information we have on Samuel Hill. As you may know, Who Was Who in America, Vol. 1 (1943), credits Mr. Hill with A. B. degrees from both Haverford College (1878) and Harvard (1879), and states that he was an Overseer of Harvard, 1900-1906. The Alumni Office at Haverford may have information on his stay there.
