

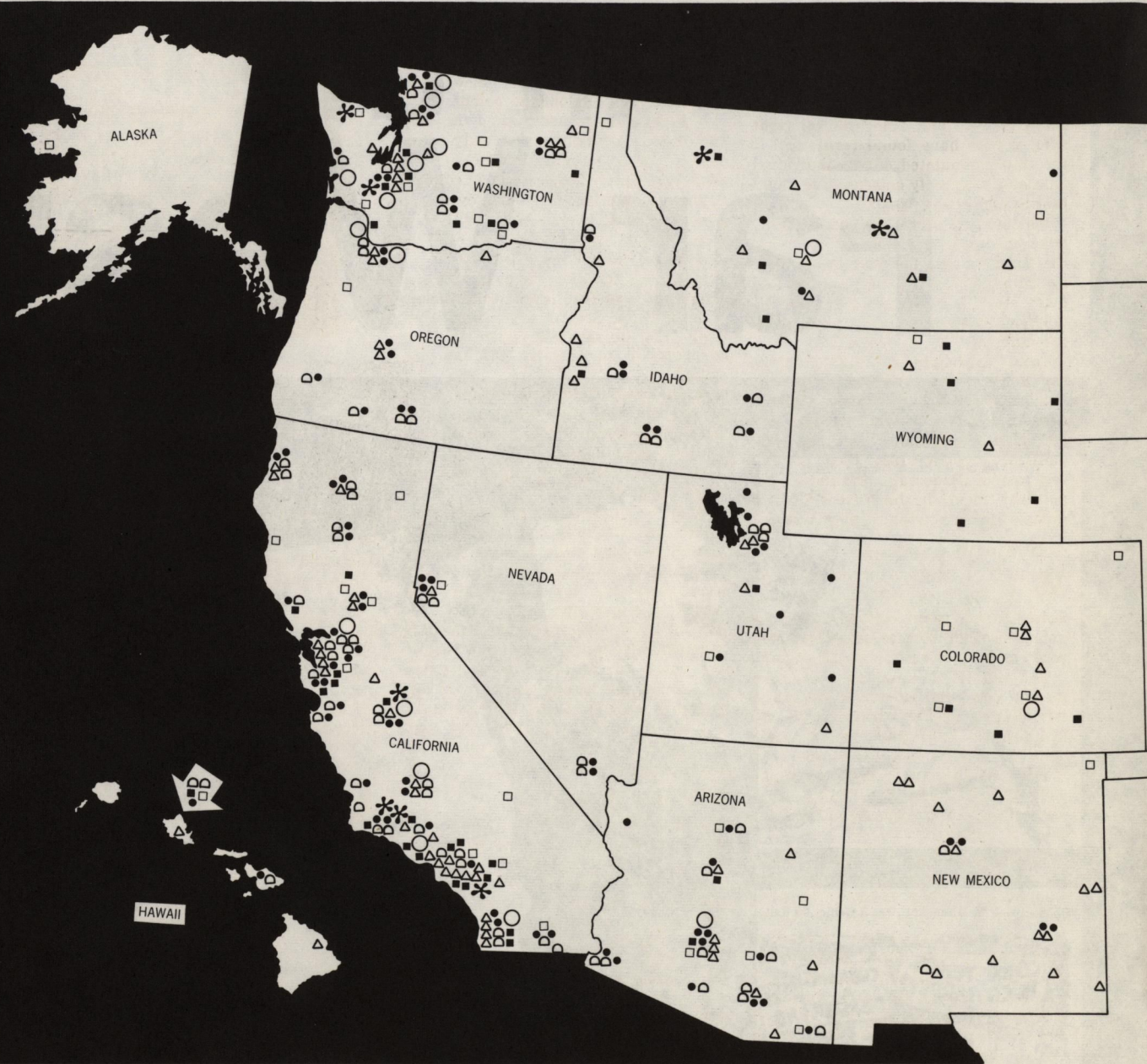

Life Lines—The propaganda network of pamphlets, radio and TV broadcasts operated by H. L. Hunt, the oil billionaire who described the ideal state in his book, *Alpaca*: "The more taxes you pay, the more votes you get. . . if you accept state aid because you are poor or sick, you cannot vote at all, and you're denied an old-age pension. . ."

Dan Smoot—An ex-FBI man who started with H. L. Hunt as the voice of "Facts Forum," now broadcasts and prints his "Dan Smoot Report." Sample Smoot views include abolition of the income tax, impeachment of Chief Justice Warren, defense of ex-General Walker, and "the suspicion that the Cuban invasion fiasco was organized betrayal, planned in Washington and Moscow. . ."

Manion Forum—Run by Clarence Manion, a former law school dean who is a member of the John Birch Society's National Council and active in other extremist groups too numerous to list. After President Eisenhower fired Manion from a commission for supporting the Bricker Amendment and advocating the sale of TVA to private interests, Manion started his radio-TV and newsletter operation which now claims 240 stations in 41 states.

Dr. Carl McIntire—a deposed preacher who spouts reaction and charges subversion among the National Council of Churches by means of radio and pamphlets under the name of "20th Century Reformation Hour" and "Christian Beacon," Collingwood, New Jersey. He collaborates with Maj. Bundy, Rev. Harvey Springer, Billy James Hargis and many others. He attacks the United Nations, the income tax and even "brotherhood."

Howard Kershner—President of the Christian Freedom Foundation and Editor of *Christian Economics*, a publication started with the help of Birch Society. Hargis carried free every month to 200,000 people reactionary messages such as this: ". . . the Tennessee Valley Authority is socialism and to that extent it destroyed capitalism. . . . The government farm program and the regulation of banking and transportation are socialism. . . ." (9/18/62)

Billy James Hargis—President of Christian Crusade, in Tulsa; recently President of We, The People in Chicago; and Endorser of the John Birch Society. Hargis pamphlets viciously attack the United Nations, Martin Luther King, the National Council of Churches, proposed Medicare, the Democratic farm program, organized Labor and "the brotherhood of man."

Church League of America—started to oppose the New Deal, now run by Maj. Edgar C. Bundy at Wheaton, Illinois, as a campaign against alleged subversion in the churches. For example, Bundy attacked a report submitted by the late John Foster Dulles on "the bases of a just and durable peace" as "the most shocking report that has ever come out of any church group." The Far Right may not be large in numbers, but it is large in noise and propaganda efforts.

Birchers and Allies Out to Win the West

SALT LAKE CITY—It's springtime in the Rockies and the Birchers are blooming in the valleys. The John Birch Society and other radical right-wing groups have found fertile soil in the thinly populated, highly individualistic and extremely conservative Mountain States of the West.

Western conservatives and liberals alike are concerned over the efforts of the Birchers and their ring-wing allies to intimidate opposition and to take over state legislatures and the Republican Party as well as parent-teacher associations.

From the wind-swept high plains of North Dakota to the hot deserts of Arizona, there is mounting evidence that America's right-wing radicals have picked the Mountain States as their political target for 1964. What disturbs responsible Democratic and Republican political leaders in the West is the fear-mongering of the right-wing movement.

A Hymn of Distrust

WHEN A PERSON publicly disagrees with the Birchers, as a Boise, Idaho, radio station owner has done, the right-wingers organize a campaign to try to put him out of business.

The right-wing speakers who travel up and down the valleys of the Mountain States preach "conspiracy" and distrust. No one, from former President Eisenhower to Chief Justice Earl Warren, is exempted from the right-wing attack. Even Sen. Barry Goldwater (R-Ariz.) is suspected of being a "mental healthist."

Traveling through the West, I found instance after instance of increasing Bircher and other radical right-wing activities. A Western organizer for the John Birch Society, Victor Overcash of East Glacier Park, Mont., said publicly in Casper, Wyo., what I was told in private conversations with extremists, conservatives and liberals: The Birchers and their extremist allies are concentrating their campaign in the sparsely populated Mountain States because it is easier to win elections where a few thousand votes tip the balance than it is in states like California or Texas where the votes are numerous and the campaign expensive.

In Utah, for example, estimates of Birch Society membership range from 500 to 1500, and this is in a state where Salt Lake City Mayor and former Gov. J. Bracken Lee and former Salt Lake City Police Chief W. Cleon Skousen—as well as the Benson father-and-son team—have been earnestly preaching right-wing extremism for several years.

A Chain of Evidence

EXAMPLES of the rightists' work trail like tumbleweed:

• In Idaho, a Republican radio station owner who criticized the Birch Society's authoritarian views lost ad-

vertisers after right-wing radicals put pressure on them through letter-writing and anonymous telephone campaigns.

• Right-wing groups pushed through the Idaho Legislature a loyalty oath under which all state employees, including school teachers and college professors, must swear that they never have belonged to and never will join a subversive organization.

• From Salt Lake City, Reed A. Benson, the son of former Agriculture Secretary Ezra Taft Benson, is directing a John Birch Society organizing campaign that he says has tripled Bircher membership in Utah in the last six months.

• In Utah, right-wing groups tried to prevent the state university from holding its tenth annual Model United Nations Assembly, in which 1000 high school students from throughout the state participate.

• In Wyoming, the State Legislature, which in 1959 was the first in the Nation to approve the so-called Liberty Amendment proposing abolition of the Federal income tax, passed a whole series of right-wing "memorials," including two proposed constitutional amendments designed to limit greatly the power of the Supreme Court and to prevent the reapportionment of legislatures on the basis of population.

• In North Dakota, right-wing radicals tried to grab control of the state parent-teacher association.

One of a Dozen

FROM ALL the evidence I could find, there are few Birch Society members in the Western states of Montana, Idaho, Utah, Colorado, Wyoming, Nevada, New Mexico and Arizona or in the western parts of North Dakota, South Dakota, Nebraska and Kansas.

In Utah, for example, estimates of Birch Society membership range from 500 to 1500, and this is in a state where Salt Lake City Mayor and former Gov. J. Bracken Lee and former Salt Lake City Police Chief W. Cleon Skousen—as well as the Benson father-and-son team—have been earnestly preaching right-wing extremism for several years.

But the Birchers are only one of a dozen or more right-wing extremist groups that work together closely, have some interlocking directorates, sow the same seeds of distrust of all government and profess to see a Nation duped by officials alleged to be conscious or unconscious Communist stooges.

talled the close ties among the right-wing extremist groups in a master's thesis published last summer. The groups he found working together and often sharing directors included the Birch Society, American Security Council, Freedoms Foundation, Committee of One Million, American Committee for Aid to Katanga, Young Americans for Freedom, Intercollegiate Society of Individualists, Veritas, Christian Crusade, International Services of Information and National Economic Council.

THE ONLY quarrel the other right-wing extremists have with the Birchers concerns the allegation by Robert W. Welch, founder of the Birch Society, that former President Eisenhower was promoting communism. Many of the extremists realize that this charge hurts them as well as the Birchers.

But the right-wing extremists are united in opposition to the United Nations, to disarmament, to any changes in military strategy or reduction in the size of the armed forces, to all foreign aid and to most domestic activities of the Federal Government. They would abolish the income tax and would encourage students to monitor their teachers and report anyone who talks about peace in the classroom. To the extremists, peace can mean only appeasement.

The John Birch Society, its even more disreputable fellow travelers, their so-called responsible front—Americans for Constitutional Action—are unusually active in the West.

Removal of the Cuban "cancer" is high on the right-wing priority list. The extremists also oppose President Betancourt of Venezuela, a former Communist, and demand "justice" for former Venezuelan dictator Perez Jimenez, who is in jail in Miami fighting deportation to his own country.

MANY OF the right-wingers are still concerned about the fluoridation of water and about "mental healthists" who want to "brainwash" the American people. But one right-wing organizer in Idaho, Trevlyn E. White, a former minister turned insurance salesman, told me that he is trying to get people off mental health and fluoridation and into precinct, ward, county and state politics.

For in all the Mountain States, there are elections to be won in 1964. In Montana, Senate Democratic Leader Mike Mansfield is up for reelection, while in Wyoming, Sen. Gale McGee, and in Utah, Sen. Frank Moss, both of whom are also Democrats, face extremely tough contests. The three are expected to be prime targets for the right wing.

And if the political tactics of the right-wing extremists are anything like their organizing and propaganda efforts, the mountain West is likely to see a wild, woolly, divisive and dangerous campaign in 1964.

What's wrong with the Far Right?

We can no longer dismiss these extremists as cranks. They are concentrating their campaign of fanaticism in the sparsely-settled Mountain States. Their strategy is to use every device of propaganda and intimidation in areas where a few votes can swing an election.

In the process they are sowing distrust for all American institutions—its schools, its courts, its government. What do they stand for? They stand for nothing. They are against everything.

They accuse everyone whose ideas differ from theirs as being a Communist. They impugn the integrity of the Supreme Court. They stir resentment against our participation in the United Nations.

They would destroy the American trade union movement. They want to repeal the income tax. They damn our tried and true social security system as socialism. They want to stop all foreign aid. They vilify the foreign-born and the minority-group Americans. They breed distrust of democracy. They spread seeds of suspicion everywhere.

And they do this insidious work wearing masks of respectability and labels of super-patriotism.

★ ★ ★

I wonder how many people in this country realize that they are—with their tax money—indirectly subsidizing the poisonous activities of these extremists.

I refer to the shocking misuse and abuse of the tax laws that allow these groups, under the cloak of "educational" or "religious" activity, to enjoy tax-exempt privileges.

Our tax laws apply tax-exempt privileges to income contributed to any group "organized and operated exclusively for religious or educational purposes" as long as "no substantial part of its activities . . . is carrying on propaganda." (Webster defines propaganda as "any organized or concerted group, effort, or movement to spread particular doctrines.")

Despite the expressed exclusion of propaganda groups from tax exemption, there is increasing evidence that many rightwing organizations, masquerading as educational or religious groups, are flooding the country with propaganda of the far right that is being financed by tax-free contributions.

In 1961 these organizations took in better than \$5½ million in tax-free contributions. The record is full of examples. Here are just a few: America's Future, Inc., Foundation for Economic Education, the Inter-Collegiate Society of Individualists, the Christian Anti-Communism Crusade, Lifeline Foundation, Inc., the Economists National Committee on Monetary Policy. One of the most blatant of these organizations is Lifeline Foundation—directed by Texas oilman H. L. Hunt. Lifeline broadcasts almost daily over more than 300 stations in 42 states. It equates all social legislation with socialism. It attacks foreign aid. It attacks the United Nations. It is against aid to education. It is against medical care for the aged. It damns the Supreme Court as a violator of the Constitution.

★ ★ ★

Another good example is the American Economic Foundation. It attacks the income tax. It urges that labor unions be brought under the antitrust laws lest they "seriously injure or destroy business." It calls social legislation a result of the "enervating psychology of something-for-nothing."

Traveling under the respect-

able labels of "education" and "religion" these organizations have managed to trap the Federal government into financing a substantial portion of their hate propaganda.

These radicals of the right practice character assassination without regard for the truth. They threaten merchants with boycotts. They threaten teachers with dismissal. They even try to infiltrate such worthwhile organizations as the Parent-Teacher Associations.

It is some comfort to know that many individuals and organizations around the country are using every opportunity to speak out against this danger from the right.

Newspapermen are doing a good job of denouncing the extremists. One very fine reporter, Julius Duschka of the Washington Post, visited the Mountain States some weeks ago and wrote a series of articles exposing the John Birchers and their allies.

Mr. Duschka's articles make it clear that fear of personal attack and economic retaliation is gripping the people of the Mountain States. This is the most disturbing aspect of the rightwing resurgence in that area.

★ ★ ★

In our democracy there must be room for differences of opinion. As a nation we insist on the right of citizens to dissent. What we cannot abide is the betrayal of our ideals by fear and intimidation. The rightwing extremists are entitled to the protection of the First Amendment—that is, to full freedom for the expression of their views.

But they are not entitled to employ threats, falsehoods, character assassination and economic retaliation to thwart the freedom of others. They are not entitled to use methods which themselves infringe on the free exchange of opinion by others.

Under normal circumstances these demagogues attract only the lunatic fringe. But during a crisis they become a real threat to democracy.

There is one antidote to their poison. Relentless publicity. We must make use of every forum, every means, every opportunity to expose these hawkers of fear and hate. Everyone should be angry about this growing pestilence.

We have the means to inform the people. Let us use them. With the people informed, I have no doubt that this totalitarianism of the right will be rejected.

Let us not permit ourselves to be taken off course by the sound and fury from the right. It is our tradition to tolerate extremists of many hues. But it is also our tradition not to follow them. While we fend off these fanatics, let us not forget that we must move forward with the programs that spell progress for this country.

Far Right Founded On Negativism, Smear

THE DEMOCRAT in this issue undertakes to indicate the scope of the threat of the Far Right. It undertakes to point to the basis of the current movement of the extremists: the incredibly vicious and distorted writings of Robert Welch, founder of the Birch Society and its self-styled dictatorial leader.

It undertakes to illustrate how the Far Right operates, how its activities are keyed to the technique of totalitarianism.

Welch makes no secret of this. He says he will operate the Birch Society as a dictatorship and that those who don't like it can get out.

★ ★ ★

The Far Right is keyed to intellectual dishonesty. It feeds on the frustrations of people who want a simple answer to the complicated problems of twentieth century America.

It oversimplifies complex issues, distorts the facts and advocates positions which are absurd.

It is geared to the totalitarian thesis that the end justifies the means.

It resorts to threats and intimidation. Its ready weapon is the smear.

To disagree is to be against constitutional government. To combat it is to be against anti-Communism.

It offers no solutions to the problems that confront America at home and abroad. It is the ultimate in negativism.

★ ★ ★

The Far Right in its actions and techniques follows the philosophy of Welch who called democracy a fraud.

The Far Right purports to dedicate itself to constitutional principles and individual freedom. Yet it intimidates those who would speak freely and seeks to curb the intellectual freedom of those who disagree.

The in-breeding of its views results in such weird scare stories as the one that the Army on routine maneuvers is in reality intending to turn the United States over to the United Nations as a tool of Communism.

It seeks to impeach Chief Justice Earl Warren because it disagrees with his views.

It charges secret deals between the President and the communists.

The Far Right is wild. It is not responsible.

★ ★ ★

And because of its irresponsibility it can attack where and when it decides.

It feeds on the frustrations of Americans who are tired of the Cold War, who are still paying off the indebtedness of two world wars fought to preserve freedom, who are faced with coping with the problems brought on by a rapidly expanding population that is concentrating in urban areas.

Its advice is to abandon our responsibilities abroad. The ultimate effect of this would be a victory for Communism.

Its advice is to abandon the income tax. Rather than pinpoint the real source of our indebtedness—the wars—it charges wild spending, waste, and fiscal irresponsibility.

It advocates local responsibility to meet problems national in scope with which the Federal Government is dealing.

And these same ultra-conservatives who advocate local responsibility, have historically opposed progressive local action to meet basic problems of a modern society. Look around you. Who opposes funds for better schools locally and Federal school aid nationally?

The far Rightists don't want constructive action. They want inaction.

They don't want to meet their responsibilities. They refuse to admit responsibility.

It is time the American people faced up to the threat of the Far Right.

It is up to us to point out where the dynamic programs in America originate.

They are the programs of the Democratic Party. And the dynamic philosophy is that of the Democratic Party.

The Democratic Party has been the party of action. It has been the party that met problems. It has been the party that guided America to its destiny in world leadership.

It is the basic philosophy of the Democratic Party that contains the force and the drive and the imagination that inspired the drafters of the Constitution.

The philosophy of the Democratic Party is keyed to the welfare of the people. The Democratic Party does not—and never will—tend to special interests.

The Democratic Party believes that all Americans have a right to realization of the American dream.

The Far Right would make a nightmare of this dream for millions of Americans.

FAR RIGHT—FANATICS OR LUNATICS?

Here are some sample quotes from leading spokesmen of the radical right:

ROBERT WELCH, JOHN BIRCH SOCIETY

The role he (General Eisenhower) has played, as described in all the pages above, would fit just as well into one theory as the other; that he is a mere stooge, or that he is a Communist assigned the specific job of being a political front man. . . . And so long as I can make clear the power and pervasiveness of the conspiracy, as it reaches right inside the White House, I have no wish to quarrel with any reader who finds it easier to believe that Eisenhower is a more personable Harry Truman than that he is a more highly placed Alger Hiss. For such an interpretation of his conduct brings us out at almost exactly the same point, so far as the disastrous effects on the present and future of our country are concerned.

Milton Eisenhower: Presidential Adviser. At least in appearance, had always been an ardent New Dealer, to put it mildly, and still is. Proof of at least pro-Communist leanings is implicit in his support of Owen Lattimore, and of others like him, at Johns Hopkins. In my opinion the chances are very strong that Milton Eisenhower is actually Dwight Eisenhower's superior and boss within the whole Leftwing Establishment. For one thing he is obviously a great deal smarter.

John Foster Dulles: For many reasons and after a lot of study, I personally believe Dulles to be a Communist agent who has had one clearly defined role to play; namely, always to say the right things and always to do the wrong ones.

General George Marshall: I defy anybody, who is not actually a Communist himself, to read all of the known facts about his career and not decide that since at least sometime in the 1930's George Catlett Marshall has been a conscious, deliberate, dedicated agent of the Soviet conspiracy.

HUMAN EVENTS

Social security and the health of the aged will stay political footballs. They will tend to socialize the minds of the people and condition us mentally and materially for more socialism. (January 1962) Surely, after the example set by Soviet Russia, the ultimate consequences of **compulsory** security of any sort have become too obvious to require elaboration. (Ibid.) The plain fact is that the welfare state is destroying the character of a large portion of the American people. . . . Hence, we find all sorts of chiseling in relief and benefit payments in addition to crime itself of many varieties and kinds. . . . The only way to relieve suffering and provide for the unfortunate . . . is voluntary Christian charity. (4/14/62)

On civil rights: Throughout the ugly activity of the bus-riding integrationist agitators who have been touring the South to cause trouble, and who have been illegally accommodated by some extremists . . . (7/7/61)

On conspiracy and subversion: [It was] Franklin D. Roosevelt who opened wide the door for Communist penetration of the peoples south of the Rio Grande. (3/10/54) After reading this Handbook (and other Girl Scout publications) . . . I knew that I should hereafter advise all American mothers to discourage their girls from joining that organization until it stops the UN and world government propaganda and becomes . . . a real American organization. (3/31/54)

DR. BILLY JAMES HARGIS — CHRISTIAN CRUSADE

NO ROOM IN THE INN—OR IN THE U.N.

We slapped Christ in the face at the setting up of the United Nations in San Francisco in April, 1945, just as surely as the Jews slapped Him on the night of His betrayal 2,000 years ago. We gave into Communist pressures and agreed to make no mention of Jesus Christ, or God, the Father, in United Nations Chambers. From the beginning, there has been no room for Him in the U.N.

THE TRUTH ABOUT SEGREGATION

The entire problem that confronts America today was bred in the pits of Communist debauchery and conspiracy. . . . Segregation is one of nature's universal laws. . . . No inter-mingling or cross-breeding with animals of a widely different characteristic takes place except under abnormal or artificial conditions. . . . BROTHERHOOD OF MAN . . . A SMOKE SCREEN

Many of those promoting the brotherhood concept of today will be found also among those who follow in varying degrees the Marxist class struggle theory. They will be found among those who tend to divide mankind into two classes, the keepers and the kept, through promoting welfare state socialism.

THEY HATE DEMOCRATS— THEY LIKE GOLDWATER

Here are some more sample quotes from leading spokesmen of the radical right:

WE THE PEOPLE from FREE ENTERPRISE

We, the people, are weary of **steam roller government** which every day pushes us closer to dictatorship. We are weary of **constant crises** by minority group pressures and opportunist politicians who fan the flames to **keep themselves in power**.

A conservative President would stop this!

We, the people, are weary of elections which offer us **no choice except between two Liberals**. We want an honest choice in the next election. We are weary of leaders who call themselves "Liberals," but whose radical programs endanger our liberty, security, and independence, and who disregard our sovereign rights and Constitutional safeguards.

We, the people, want a **Constitutional Conservative as candidate for President in the 1964 elections**. We do not expect the Democratic Party to offer one. So we petition the Republican Party to nominate one.

We know a Conservative can win and we would have such a man in Barry Goldwater. . . .

Former Senator William F. Knowland of California said that **Goldwater can carry the state of California**.

In current public opinion polls from coast to coast, Goldwater is the favorite for the Republican nomination. Yet Goldwater says, "I am not a candidate for the Presidency. I feel that my voice can be better heard right here in the Senate."

Its quack practitioners milk the gullible—what Nixon calls the kooks and the nuts—the frightened old ladies in tennis shoes—for real money. They spend it to

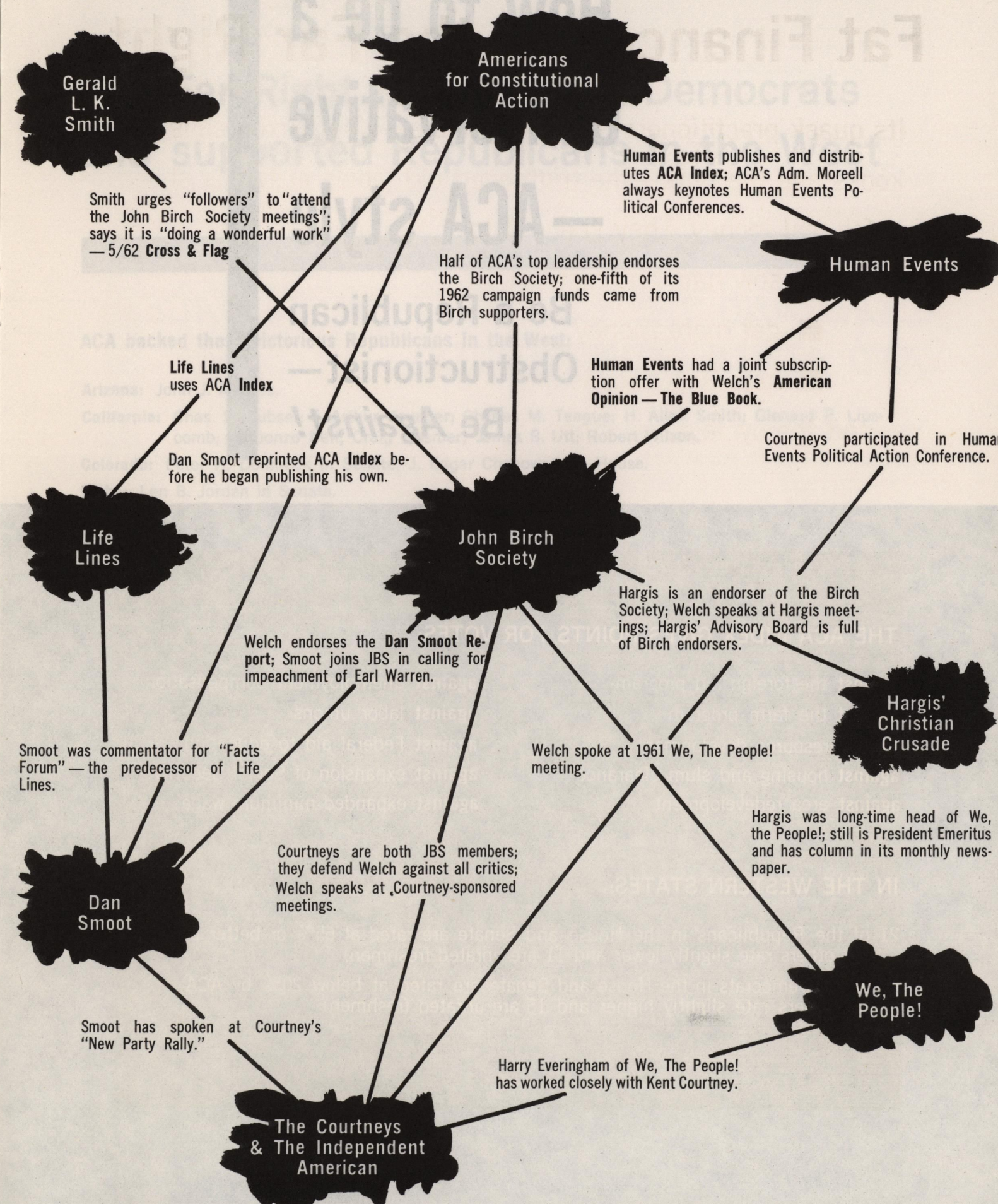

Libel THE ARTFUL DODGER



False ideas can be planted without actually stating them: "What did the mayor do with the payoff money?" or "Some say it wasn't the mayor, but his assistant." *Don't be fooled by weasel-wording — it's a cheap trick to avoid libel suits!*

BEWARE THE WITCHING HOUR



Smear artists usually wait for the last minute to launch their most damaging lies. Be skeptical about any new charge that appears for the first time just before Election Day. *Don't let a last-minute smear panic you into switching your vote!*

ON \$7 BILLS

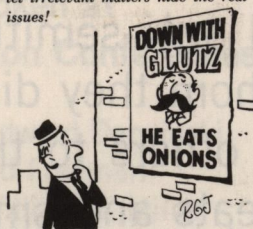
Some organizations and publications that crop up out of nowhere in election campaigns are "just as phony" as a \$7 bill. Make sure the name of



the organization is *exactly* what it "sounds something like." Look for names of officers, and the address. Check by phone or in person. *Don't forget: you can't buy facts with \$7 bills!*

SO WHATMANSHIP

This is your best defense against irrelevant statements. If it doesn't have some reasonable connection with the candidate or the office he seeks, ask yourself, "so what?" *Don't let irrelevant matters hide the real issues!*

INVISIBLE AUTHORS

Who wrote it? Who published it? *Missing name or address means the author is hiding. Ask yourself why. (Anonymous campaign literature is against the law in national and most state elections.) Don't let invisible authors tell you how to vote!*

THE MISSING PAPERS



Where is the proof? If a sensational charge is not documented, insist on seeing the evidence before you believe it. *Don't fall for guilt by accusation!*

THE LITTLE MAN



WHO WASN'T THERE

Photo trickery can sneak people into or out of real pictures. If a photo seems too "pat" or incriminating, ask the person it's aimed at. If it's a fake, he should be able to prove it. *Don't be tricked by trick photography!*

part of NOTHING BUT THE TRUTH

Leaving out a key word can reverse the meaning of a quotation. (Black is ~~never~~ white.) By itself a single vote or statement often is misleading. *Get the whole story!*



SECRETS OF WIFE-BEATING

Do you still beat your wife? *There is no right answer. Either way, you lose. "I have no proof he still beats his wife, as everybody believes," is a switch on the same trick. Don't let political con men start a rumor by denying one you've never heard!*

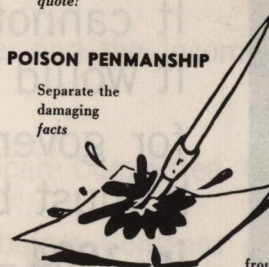


THE WONDERFUL TIME MACHINE

Note the dates on quotations. Statements of 10 or 50 or 100 years ago often don't have the same meaning today. Parties and other organizations change with the times. *Don't base your vote on an out-of-date quote!*
