GEORGE UMTUCH, CHAIRMAN OF THE GENERAL COUNCIL,
TODAY EXPRESSED HIS CONCERN ABOUT THE CONTINUED USE OF THE NAME OF
THE GENERAL COUNCIL OF THE YAKIMA TRIBE BY CERTAIN PARTIES WHO HOLD
THEMSELVES OUT AS A FISH COMMISSION ESTABLISHED BY THE GENERAL COUNCIL.
MR. UMTUCH SAID THAT THIS CONTINUED USE WAS UNAUTHORIZED BY THE GENERAL
COUNCIL. ISSIGNED AN ORDER IN MARCH WHICH I HAD DOUBTS ABOUT, AND MY
INQUIRY TO THE PROPER LEGAL AUTHORITIES PROVED MY DOUBTS TO BE WELL
FOUNDED, UMTUCH SAID. THE SOLICITOR'S OFFICE AT THE DEPARTMENT OF
INTERIOR, AS EARLY AS MARCH, HAS INFORMED BOTH ME AND ALL OTHER PERSONS
INVOLVED THAT THIS GROUP OF PEOPLE WHO HOLD THEMSELVES OUT AS THE
"COLUMBIA RIVER GENERAL COUNCIL FISH COMMISSION OF THE YAKIMA INDIAN
NATION" ARE NOT AN EFFECTIVE LEGAL BODY. I, THEREFORE, DO HOPE THAT
NO ONE WILL BE CONFUSED BY THEIR CONTINUED USE OF THE WORDS GENERAL
COUNCIL OR YAKIMA NATION. BEING ESTABLISHED WITHOUT AUTHORITY THEY
CANNOT AND DO NOT SPEAK FOR THE YAKIMA NATION OR THE GENERAL COUNCIL.
