Dear Mr. Lindstrom:

Enclosed are a few extra clips of the Sunday story. Wasn't much of a story because things like that are usually done pretty hurriedly to "meet a deadline."

I'm looking forward to the picture referred to. It is seldom that I'm portrayed with my agency and Indian friends, in spite of the many Indian photos I myself have taken and have.

For your information, I'm enclosing an advance circular of the more pretentious book, Drummers and Dreamers which will not be issued until next spring or early summer. It of course was delayed quite a while because of the Priest Rapids dam, but it looked like that was cleared up without jeopardizing the few little Wanapums so the publisher announced it on his trade list and prepared the advance circulars.

If you wish to order, I shall be most happy to include your order in one that I will be placing personally before long. [I've still got a battle ahead and have to send out some to a few congressmen, senators, the Indian Bureau etc/] Then when it is published before too late next spring or summer, I'll distribute it properly embellished with thumb print of Puck Hyah Toot (They introduced him as Johnny Buck at the dedication)

If you would want to pick it up at one of the book stores here, you could note so on the margin and they'd notify you when it came in.

If you want it sent direct by the publisher, he prefers no payment until he sends a bill shortly before publication.

Of course that is presuming that you want a copy.

The Indians have promised me that they will visit book stores here, in Seattle, Portland, Spokane, Walla Walla, Pasco, etc. when it is issued. Soon I'll be so swamped with other things in connection with publication I'll have little chance to "promote" it as now. The publisher has limited promotional facilities, but has reached a standard in books published that many college and university libraries, museums etc. have standing orders in for all books issued.

If you happen to know of others who might be interested, it would be appreciated if you'd pass along one of the enclosed circulars to them, but it should be clearly understood that the book will not be out until later..
