Start in the '70s and pick out three for these years, 1873, 1874 and 1877.

Then go to the 1880s for these

IF you do not have any for those years, or the complete six, PICK out those you have for those years and then fill out the six with these, in the order, 1886, 1887, 1888 and 1890.

I believe that you will be able to pick six out from this list. Then, let me know the years you have left and I'll see how they fit into my various runs.

If you are able to fill them, I expect to buy others, starting in where we leave off.

When I know the other books in this series you have, there is time for the New York book trades, and as you know they are better than the "usual" run of books. But as I am NOT a dealer, books to me are viewed differently, especially with someone with whom I transact business.

If you have any of the Messages and Documents, jot down a few years and prices for me.

Dear Mr. Klenotiz:

Thank you for your trouble in filling my orders, and especially for your time in writing. I'll try and do business in such a manner as to eliminate that time-consuming chore, (writing too much).

The Indian Commissioner report, first ordered, came in. It is in very good condition. None of the others, including Indians Taxed etc. have arrived but they'll be here. Then I can determine what I owe you for the difference between \$16.50 and \$18.50. I'm more than happy to pay the difference.

Enclosed is check for \$28.75, for three commissioner of Indian Affairs books, 1887, 1890 and 1888. (Unless more come in that will fix me up. But I have a few other missing dates in most years but the 70s and 80s, and maybe not all of those years.)

The check includes \$8.50 for the Story of the Wild West.. Buffalo Bill Cody, and \$6.50 for Life and Memoir John Charles Fremont, 1856. I've added as you suggested, 25 cents for each book for postage, \$1.25.

I'm looking for Fremont, Report of Exploring Expedition to Rocky Mountains 1842, with "pocket" map, the four or five Vol. of Wilkes Expedition, & naval lieutenant) and old books on horses, horse training, carriage making, harness making, harness or carriage or buggy catalogues, just in case any of these show which I can handle.

If I find you don't come out ok on postage and the price difference on the Indians Taxed and Untaxed, I will see you come out ok.

Dear Woodward:

Checked out the list last night and tonight without completing the last few pages, but they seem to run pretty uniform.

Figuring each page at WHAT A DEALER WOULD ASK FOR THEM, \$218 to \$183 a page, or by average, \$200, the total dealer sale price is \$1,400

Figuring the standard dealer's discount, 60 per cent for some types of books and 40 per cent for others you get \$740 or \$560. So it would not be out of line to ask \$1,000 for a nation-wide dealer covering all states who has a fast turnover and needs books of the type.

Of course, many on the list are still in print and available, brand new at the price.

However the books could be offered as fine condition, most in dust jackets, many autographed and inscribed, several limited editions and no ex-library or used books. This is a big asset.

I might be a trifle high on my estimate of asking prices but persons wanting this type of book are used to higher than ordinary prices.

I hope this is of some general value to you. I enjoyed my visit with you.
