The second was a showing by Mrs. Myra Wiggins who has lived in Toppenish and Yakima and whose daughter, Mrs. Reuben Benz, still lives here. Many of Mrs. Wiggins friends came to see her when she had her exhibit.

The second period was attended by large groups of people because our three Savings and Loan Associations had their Thrift Week in January and we were able to keep this showing in our cases thru February 22.

Mr. Walter Graham's pictures were also a large attraction. Mr. Graham is a commercial artist at Wenatchee.

Our largest attended case exhibit was brought here from the Washington University Museum thru our superintendent, Mr. M. M. Martin, to help the teachers of our city schools as well as those of the whole county.

Next year, instead of Lincoln, we intend having Washington in the spotlight during our Thrift Week exhibit.
