


Read first time February 8, 1967, and referred to Committee on Transportation.

AN ACT Relating to public highways; authorizing and directing the state highway commission to make a feasibility study of adding a highway from the Lewis River to the Yakima area to the state highway system; and making an appropriation. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

NEW SECTION. Section 1. The Washington state highway commission is hereby authorized and directed to make, or cause to be made, a study of the feasibility and need of adding to the state highway system a highway commencing from SSH No. 1-S in the vicinity of the Lewis River and Yale northeasterly to an intersection with PSH No. 3 in the Yakima area.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. There is appropriated from the motor vehicle fund to the Washington state highway commission the sum of one hundred thousand dollars, or so much thereof as shall be necessary, to finance this study.
