Dear Rob.

Your letter came Saturday found us all pretty well. I have Auntie Mary with me that helps me a great deal as she is doing all the work for me I am not able to do much my self. yesterday I had a bad spell but thank God it did not last very long today I am very tired yesterday your Father was sixty nine years old so I made him a Lemon pie and a birthday cake. He scolded me for it and said that brought on my bad spell. but I wanted him to have something I am very sorry you lost your job. for you as well as for us. Arnold sent us fifty Dollars and Will payed his interest. you seem to be rather unfortunate let us hope for something better this time. I was out for a ride last week and was very tired. I can stand but very little even having some one come in and talk to me hurts me. so I have to go to bed. your Father and Everett have been picking all day and have three cars picked &c

you may know how poor they are. we had two different parties up here to look at the farm last week. I wish some one would take it. you know Everett works the place. for as he is to have four hundred Dollars when there is not much fruit and when we have a full crop he will get the place on half. now you see that is a good deal of money but we could not do anything else. but it will leave us rather short this year if we should sell before the season is over we will have to pay him some any way. now I have three more letters to write. so will have to make this one short I do hope you will get your money and that you have found good work by this time. I am glad you are keeping well and hope every thing will go well with you my boy Will did not come home yesterday he is not contented here he likes Portland so much better than Chicago and he made over a hundred dollars in three weeks. he should be satisfied now my boy I must stop love from every one here and best wishes for good work and love from your Mother

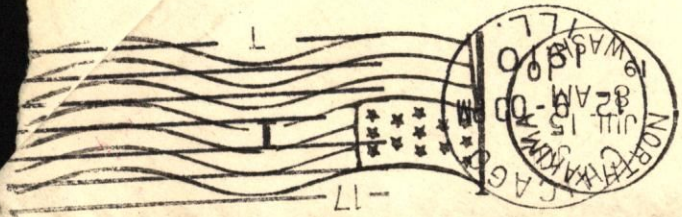
