Your letter received several
days ago - Fish Hawk was not
a chief - I think he was after a pattern
of a chief - He was a warrior but
always a friend of the Whites
so far as I know. Till late in
life he was very dissipated but before
his death he joined the Protestant
mission church - which is only
six miles from Pendleton
The Indians on the Umatilla Reservation

did not join in the
war of '78 against the
whites - I have about
2600 good negative
taken by my late husband
some very fine ones + valuable
from his torical stand point
I think there is one of fish Hawk
that I think is the finest Indian
head in existence - but many
other famous Indians + chiefs
that have passed ~~at~~ - so there
no chance of a duplicate.

I have a good many ~~prints~~ photos
+ also have a book of Indian photos
I sell photos + also the book

I am glad to have any one
interested in Indian look them
over any time whether they come



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to buy any or not—
I have an enlarged photo of
Ash Hawk hanging in my house
that I think is wonderful
if at any time you come to
