Dear Sir:

I told you I would keep you informed regarding our October correspondence relative to foundry casting of proposed works.

I note that our correspondence has made no reference to the condition of the works, FOB. By that I mean chasing or patina on the bronze and burnishing on the aluminum.

I am enclosing airmail postage for a brief note on this, just general.

Representatives are endeavoring to line up their busy schedule with construction in progress to visit me, perhaps in a few days to look over sketches and discuss the cost estimates provided them (actual figures as provided by you and Mr. Etll. I wish to be in a position to answer other possible questions.

Also, of help, would be a very general time schedule, such as life-size head casting from date of delivery to foundry to founding and a larger, say 7 foot work. Make the estimate safely, please, say four months if three are normally required. And in the matter of cost I will ask for some leeway.
